ANN SULLIVAN

Ann is the Treasurer of U3A Rotorua. A significant member of U3A for something like 17 years, Ann does the financial stuff. With Ann, the buck stops here!

Ann was born in 1940 in Spennymoor (sounds expensive) County Durham. Her war years were spent in Spennymoor and London. Post-war, Ann grew up in Paddington, being schooled in London to GCE 'A' Level A teacher at various Catholic schools, she emigrated to New Zealand with her husband Andrew in 1967 on the swept-up Northern Star.

In 1973 Ann registered with the newly created "Open University" in England to do a degree by correspondence and taking exams in London. She was helped by Andrew and her patient long-suffering London-based mother. Her reward after five years was an Upper Second Class Honours Degree in Mathematics.

Andrew, a mechanical engineer, also became a teacher and they lived and taught in Whanganui, Hamilton and Tauranga.

They divorced in 1986 and Ann ended up in Rotorua where she was a tutor at Waiariki Polytechnic for 20 years.

An inaugural member of Rotorua U3A in 2007, Ann remembers Mel Bowen and Judy Somerville who became President and Membership Secretary, while Ann became, what else but Treasurer.

She has a great interest in the outdoors and has tramped many NZ National Parks. The summit of her tramping days came in 1975 when she joined a group to walk from near Kathmandu to Mt Everest Base Camp. Three weeks of 8 hour daily walking at high altitude. No wonder one of her boots fell apart on the very last day. She is now convenor of the U3A Walking Group. Indoors, for 30 years Square Dancing was another major interest, with Ann "doing the Kiwi thing" — President, Secretary, Treasurer of the Sulphur City Square Dancers on a rotating basis.

In later years, a strong emphasis has been on predator control at Blue Lake, with Ann acting as co-convenor of the U3A Ratbags. Here she is proudly holding her first dead rat. Some 3,600 pests have been terminated since U3A took up the pursuit in 2019.

NEW U3A TECHNOLOGY

The new U3A wireless modem is used to connect a computing device to the internet in situations where no **conventional** internet access is available **via WiFi or fibre**. It connects a computing device to the internet via the mobile telephone data network instead.

Some of us may use this already in cases where the telephone company does not want to repair or extend an existing copper or fibre landline connection and (unbeknown to the customer) installs a wireless modem instead. It saves the telephone and

internet provider paying Chorus for the use of their cable network – all this after respective governments spent billions installing fibre all over the country.

This technology is a god-send for the farming community. Many there are not connected via fibre. It now gives them full-speed internet access, using a wireless modem, as long as they are within mobile phone coverage.

The U3A wireless modem is available, via **Mel Bowen**, to any group that needs the internet in locations where there is no internet access, such as the Bridge Club rooms or the Parksyde rooms. Written usage instructions, and the password, are in the box with the modem.
