From fighting apartheid head-on to cimbing Everest – this action man has found freedom "fantastic" in Rotorua.

Trevor was the sole coloured member of the South African second post-apartheid Everest expedition. The 14 man team spent three months on the mountain's treacherous North Face. Climbing Everest is by one of Trevors many achievements.

These include his activism against the authorities, helping to signal the end of apartheid in South Africa. Trevor was present at Capetown's infamous Trojan Horse massacre October 15th, 1985. No stranger to violent situations, he survived a hold-up in the notorious Cape Town Flats. His assailants were intent on murdering him but the gun failed to fire...maybe divine intervention? Trevor is inclined to think so.

Despite his humble background, Trevor achieved a Bachelor of Arts in Education bolstered by a post-graduate degree in Higher Education.

He also inherited his father's love of climbing. Passing a stringent selection procedure (25,000 applicants!), Trevor was able to fulfil a childhood dream — the climbing of Everest. Despite being the only non-white in the team, he had no difficulty brushing aside allegations of tokenism, fully realising his wonderful achievement for what it was. The ascent was full of challenges and he revelled in them.








Post-Everest, Trevor has had various international roles, usually involving deprived young people. He was a Programme Manager for VSA (Volunteer Service Abroad) and a Jump executive in South East Asia. He and wife Michelle spent the covid pandemic in Luganville, Vanuatu. Trevor has visited over 70 countries

The pair moved to Rotorua just over a year ago. A clean, green environment is what they were after and they enjoy the local manaakitanga. Trevor is a soccer (football) man; he coaches the Ngongotaha Lakes team, is a Level 3 referee and a Licensed FIFA agent.

Cherishing the outcomes of their move, Trevor and Michelle were quick to apply for residency. Now "110% Kiwi", he has given up his South African passport. And, he is devoted to the All Blacks; a true mark of Patriotism.

year.

Despite promising promotion opportunities in London, Paul applied for NZ jobs and landed a Regional Council Engineering role in Wellington. Here, among other things, he worked on the National Library and, in the spirit of his father, took up flying, gaining his pilot's licence in 1984.

He moved on to the Lower Hutt Drainage Company, his vocational home for 10 years. Thence to Taumarunui in 1994 to be CEO of Ruapehu DC LATE(Local Authority Trading Enterprise), and then his own firm (Paul Gellatly Consulting Engineer) for a rewarding 21 Years. Of his numerous engineering activities, the one he enjoyed most was the inspection and rating of bridges which provided him the opportunity to travel all over New Zealand.

Now retired, Paul resides in Lynmore. Son Neil and his wife Katrina and Paul's 15 year old granddaughter live in Alexandra – a good summer visit spot. Daughter Elizabeth is a paramedic, living with her partner Brad in Lake Hood near Ashburton. Come to think of it another good spot to visit in summer.
